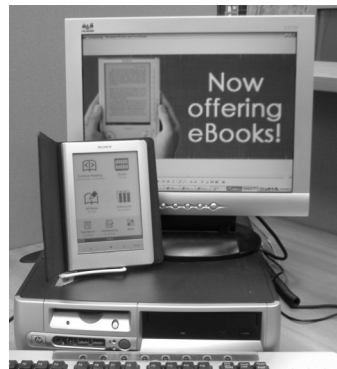


## Downloadable Ebooks and Reader @Your Library

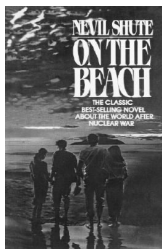

Join us on the first Monday of each month at 7 p.m. Newcomers are welcome. Professional Development Credit is available.



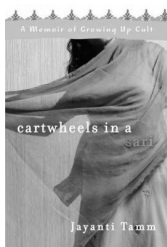
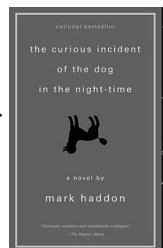
September 13, 2010 at 7 p.m.

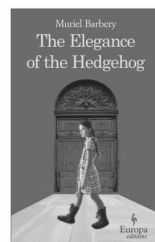
