“Lost and Found: Photographs of Beautiful Buildings that Once Graced Nutley” is on view at the Nutley Public Library through September 30. The exhibition presents more than 20 historical photographs of Nutley buildings that no longer exist. All photographs are from the collection of the Nutley Museum and Historical Society.

“We are blessed to live in a town where so many historical buildings still exist,” says Barry Lenson, Art Director of the Nutley Museum. “Our Town Hall is actually a building that was part of a mill complex in the nineteenth century. We also still have the Nutley Museum, the Kingsland Manor, the Women’s Club, and other wonderful buildings from the past. Yet many beautiful older buildings have been lost. This new exhibition will present photos of many of them, including the Yountakah Country Club, the Feland Mansion, and more. It is my hope that everyone who visits this exhibition will come away with a deeper appreciation for everything that our town was, and what it is now.”

The Nutley Museum and Historical Society is located at 65 Church Street, Nutley, NJ, in a one-room brick school house that was once the town’s only school. The Museum houses a collection of town artifacts as well as artworks by former Nutley artists Reginald Marsh, Michael Lenson, Charles Hawthorne, Edward Loyal Field, and others.
