

ome people live in a neighborhood; for other people, the neighborhood lives in them. Sam and Michele Fleitell are part of the very fabric in Nutley as they have raised their family here, own a successful business, and serve the community in several vital areas.

For this couple, the town has served as a backdrop for their lives together.

And for Michele, Nutley was the place where she grew up.

"I attended Holy Family School and graduated from Nutley High School," she said. "Then I attended Montclair State University when it was Montclair State College."

Her college degree opened the door for a very rewarding career.

"I worked in the Newark Public Schools for 38 years, and retired in 2008," Michele said. "I started as a foreign language teacher, then became a guidance counselor, and later moved into administration. I thoroughly enjoyed all of my years in education, and I admire young people who go into the profession today. It is much more difficult, yet still very rewarding. It takes a special person to teach."

Sam grew up in another part of Essex County.
"I'm from the Ironbound section of Newark," he said. "I

graduated from East Side High School and attended Rutgers University-Newark."

Michele and Sam met in 1979 and were married in 1981.

"We chose to live in Nutley so we could raise our children here because of the school system," Michele said. "We also love the small-town nature."

The couple have two children, Rachel and Michael.
"Rachel is married to Chris



Jones, and they have one son, Skylar, who is two, and a daughter, Mila May, who is four months old," Michele said. "They live in Manhattan, while our son, Michael, lives in California."

Back here in Nutley, Michele and Sam may be best known as the owners of Trio Jewelers.

"Sam's creative side has had him running Trio Jewelers since 1983," Michele said. "In those years, he has become a master jeweler, working on gold, silver, and platinum. He repairs and creates custom pieces of jewelry, and oftentimes will repair pieces of costume jewelry. Sam tells his customers 'I don't stand on ceremony, anything is possible! If I can fix it, I will.' He knows each piece of jewelry is important to the customer. Repairs are done on the premises. Sam specializes in engagement rings. He can provide his customers with a design, a diamond, or other precious stone to create a one-of-a-kind ring."

Sam also understands how local businesses bring value to the entire town.

"From the beginning of Trio Jewelers in 1983, I made sure to get involved in the Nutley business community," Sam said. "We recently moved to Centre Street, but in the early years, I sat on committees with previous commissioners to help improve the business district. I personally try to do business locally and encourage others to do the same."

"As business owners, we like to support the community in many ways," Michele said. "Over the years, we have sponsored Little League teams, women's softball teams, recreation sports teams, and have donated to school organizations."

Yet, their contribution to the community also comes with their personal involvement.

"Sam was previously president of the Nutley Family Service Bureau, Nutley Rotary, and Nutley Football Boosters, and currently serves on the boards for the Nutley Educational Foundation and Essex County Mental Health Services," Michele said. "He has been a member of various

Michele has been closely associated with a very special and caring organization.

"I have been president of the Nutley Thriving Survivors since its inception in 2003," she said. "This is an organization that supports women who live or work in Nutley who have been affected by breast cancer. We sponsor a candlelight walk and a brunch in October. This year, pink hoodie sweatshirts were worn by all who registered. It is always a warm and wonderful evening."

f you were to ask Michelle Palmer, what's new? be prepared to hear about some amazing things that are going on in her life. But at the beginning of October, Michelle published her first children's book.

While every author has a reason for writing a book, whether it's to entertain, educate, or to take the reader on an adventure, Brinco Finds His Way Home was written for all of them.

"My goal for writing the book was to inspire children to love being bilingual and take an interest in learning about different cultures," Michelle said. "I have

been a teacher for sixteen years and feel like this would be a wonderful story to promote diversity, as well as confidence, when learning something that seems challenging at first."

Michelle chose a delightful way to tell this important story, one that is guaranteed to keep young readers interested.

"Brinco, a bunny, wants to find his way home," she said. "This experience leads to unlikely friendships, daring adventures, and a love for language learning. As the story unfolds, the reader journeys through beginner Spanish

conversations. The characters and the context of the story opens young minds to appreciate exploring new places. The book is a great addition to any home or classroom library for all future bilinguals."

As an elementary school teacher, Michelle knows how to connect young minds with big ideas.

"The targeted age group for the book is kindergarten through fifth grade," she said. "Younger children can have the story read to them and then engage in a discussion using the questions at the end of the book. Older readers would find the story relatable as they learn a second language or overcome obstacles that initially made them feel nervous."

The colorful illustrations help the story unfold visually, allowing the concepts to be easily grasped.

"I met the illustrator, Alicia Wallace, in an online group for children's books," Michelle said. "She is a speech pathologist and mom of two living in Long Island. We connected over our mutual love for reading, animals, and child development."

Brinco Finds His Way Home is a wonderful book to put into young readers' hands and to open their minds to appreciate different cultures and languages. Look for it on Amazon or at Pretty Handy.

The Real Winning at Enforcer **Fitness**

hris Conca knows about winning. After graduating Nutley High School in 1991, he competed on the amateur boxing circuit, going on to win the welterweight division of the 1994 New Jersey Golden Gloves tournament in Elizabeth.

He turned professional in 1995 and competed in championship bouts throughout the United States, England, and Denmark. Winning the New Jersey Diamond Gloves marked a career highlight, but Chris retired from the ring in 1997 to start a family.

But in 2017, he opened Enforcer

Fitness in Nutley, placing Chris Conca once again in competition mode. But now, instead of seeking victory in the ring, he looks to win the futures of today's young people.

"My goal here is to help kids gain self-confidence and to improve both their mental and physical health," Chris said. "Since 2020, I see a lot of kids who are depressed. There's also a lot of bullying and substance abuse in schools and in the community. Our future is these kids, and I want to help them."

Enforcer Fitness is a lot more than a boxing gym. Alongside their very high standards of physical fitness training is a personal approach that turned this facility in a

"I trained in Newark and New York at different gyms, and that's where I learned real life skills," Chris said. "I credit that with getting me ready to be in the world. Kids here need that









same type of coaching. They need to be in a safe place where they can talk about what's going on in their lives. The other staff members and I are always ready to listen."

Chris understands the type of challenges young people face today and has specific programs designed to meet those needs.

"I believe that if you feel you can handle yourself, you feel good about yourself," he said. "We have self-defense classes that help kids gain confidence and build self-esteem. There are group classes for boys and girls, ages 13-17, and for men and women over 18. This instruction helps to prevent them from being bullied because being aware of themselves and those who bully can stop a negative situation into spiraling into violence."

A lot of what Chris Conca brings to his facility is what shaped his early years.

"I molded the spirit of Enforcer Fitness on the old-school values that I learned and am now passing along to my students," he said. "I teach basic values like having respect for women, teachers, and our country. I talk to these kids like they were my own."

When these young people enter the doors of Enforcer Fitness, they become part of a community where winning is more than getting a trophy or medal. They learn the larger definition of winning, which is gaining mastery over yourself, both physically and mentally.

For Chris Conca, the future of our young people is perhaps the biggest fight he will ever undertake, but he's more than ready and willing to do so. ■

This year's proceeds benefited the **Nutley Music Boosters Association** and the Rotary Scholarship Fund.





Graeme J. Hardie Writes About Oaks in His Garden

Well, my tree is two trees which stand in our garden. One is a tall oak which reaches high into the sky. The other is shorter but with spreading arms and a tree trunk of 14 feet. Most likely about 300 years old. An early discoverer trying to find a way to the east ran into New Jersey in the 16th century and remarked on the density of oaks. Now we still have oaks of that period, such as mine, and mostly they are on the brow of our hills. I hope we can maintain them for posterity by cutting back the dead wood when necessary and feeding them annually. They are truly glorious trees, and they need us to protect and nurture them so that they outlast this generation. Before you consider taking down one of these grand oaks standing in your yard, consider the long life they have had and will continue to have with your care.


