

As our Nutley Neighbors, Karen, Carl, Natalie, and Nicholas Brownson, bring their separate interests to the community to make a distinctive sound.

And it's no surprise that Carl and Karen met at an event

that is known for an auditory performance, although maybe not quite the

kind you're thinking of.

"Carl and I met through mutual friends in 2012 at a Fourth of July party in New York City," Karen said. "I am originally from New Hope, Pennsylvania, and he is from Nashville, Tennessee. We both moved to New York for graduate school."

Karen has a bachelor's degree in music from Bard College and a master's in music education from Hunter College.

"I play the harp with the Bloomfield Symphony Orchestra and perform at private events as a solo harpist, as well as in an ensemble with other local musicians," she said. "I am in my 14th year teaching music at the Ridge Street School, a public pre-K through 8th grade school in Newark."

Carl's degrees also placed him in the school system, in a different setting.

"I received a bachelor's degree in philosophy from the University of Tennessee and my PhD in philosophy from the CUNY Graduate Center," he said. "I'm a



philosophy professor at Lehman College in the Bronx. Right now, I am developing a religious studies program at the college and am involved in helping to bring standardized test prep programs to students who can't otherwise afford them."

Marriage and parenthood gave the couple new decisions

to make.

"We moved here from the city after having our little girl, Natalie, and our little boy, Nick, was born here," Karen said. "We didn't realize until we arrived what a wonderful community we were moving into. We feel so grateful to have such terrific people around us as we raise our children here."

Moving to Nutley gave this family plenty of opportunities to pursue activities that make them happy.

"I began running short distances in 2019 which really made me appreciate the beautiful Nutley parks," Karen said. "During the pandemic, I started increasing my mileage and joined a running club in Montclair. I am currently training for the TCS New York City Marathon

in November which will be my first full marathon."

"Carl has been playing tennis competitively since he was a child and is active in several local leagues," she continues. "He is a member of the Nutley Tennis Club."

The children are also expressing their individual interests in fun and creative ways.

"Natalie is a second grader at Washington School," Karen said. "She is in a Brownie troop, and I am one of the leaders. Nick is in preschool at Spring Garden School. He loves climbing, building, and going to the different playgrounds in Nutley. Both children look forward to their swim lessons at SafeSplash Swim School in Cedar Grove every week."

As the family interacts with the community through sports, school, and groups, Karen had a wonderful oppor-

tunity recently to share her music for a worthwhile cause.

"This past September, I performed the harp at the Garden Party at the Mountsier-Hardie garden to benefit the **Nutley Family Service** Bureau," she said. "I had never been to that event before and it was an incredible way to experience the talents of so many local musicians and restaurants, all while supporting the NFSB in an absolutely stunning setting."

Nutley UNICO members have a long-time tradition of marching in the Nutley St. Patrick's Day Parade and 2023 was no exception. A great day for St. Pat!



Styling With Sensitivity

magine having a child with sensory issues who is sensitive to touch, sight, and sound. Now imagine bringing your child for a haircut.

Your Kind of Cuts, located on Centre Street, and business owner William (Billy) Dinnerstein, cater to children and adults with special needs, especially those with autism, who, like everyone else, need to have their hair cut. I had the privilege of spending an afternoon watching the patience of Billy and his staff and enjoying the warmth and caring in his shop.

I had walked into the shop feeling down, but I walked out uplifted and with a renewed faith knowing there are people like Billy in this world.

Billy and his amazing staff go the distance to make children and adults, who are frightened by a haircut, feel at ease. I watched Billy interact with at least four children who are autistic, and it was nothing short of inspirational.

Getting a haircut is very challenging when you have autism. The touch and sounds can be overwhelming and Billy knows exactly how to get it done with patience and compassion.

His shop is filled with sensory toys to keep everyone happy during a haircut. A certificate is received after the first cut, and the children get to pick a toy after every return visit. Billy makes sure the kids know that being nervous or scared is okay if you try to be brave.

His top priority is making everyone feel comfortable while getting a haircut, even if he must sit on the floor in the corner with his client.

The happiness he sees on a mom's face when her child can finally walk into a shop and get a haircut is his motivation to keep his business going.

There are not many shops like Billy's, and people will travel to get here. The past few years word has spread through the autism community, and children and adults are willing to drive a long distance once they hear about Your Kind of Cuts.

Another interesting fact about Billy is the township officially recognized him for his brave actions in helping rescue a driver who was trapped in a submerged vehicle in the Passaic River. Nutley officers dove into the river after Billy directed them to the location of a vehicle, which had plunged down the boat ramp north of the Kingsland Avenue Bridge. Once the occupant was removed from the submerged vehicle, Billy also jumped into the water to help police bring the victim to shore. The township formally passed three resolutions commending everyone involved for their selfless, brave, and heroic actions.

Billy Dinnerstein has also hosted many events in his shop, and in front of his shop, to entertain clients and our township. Billy, along with his incredible staff, are remarkable people in my opinion.

His story and Your Kind of Cuts speak of determination and a desire to give back. ■





Nutley Junior Raiders Are Climbing to the Summit

years is a long time to do anything. It's long enough to see how far one has come and to know how far one still has to go. 10 years is the length of time that Coach Michael Blanchard has been involved with wrestling and he knows all too well how long it took to see progress happen.

"In 2020, our Suburban team was 8 and 3," he said. "In 2021, our season got canceled due to Covid. In 2022, we went 10 and 0, winning our Suburban league and our end of the season tournament. In 2023, we're looking for new challenges and new summits to climb."

"We joined the Twin County League, a great organization with an infrastruc-

ture that provides wrestling opportunities to levels of our program," Blanchard explains. "We were able to have our best wrestlers compete in their dual league and gain valuable experiences for our younger wrestlers as well."

Blanchard's comment might be an understatement. The team did not just compete. They went 11 and 0 this season; winning the Northeast Division and then winning the Twin County League Championship that pits the top 3 teams from each division against each other in a playoff series to crown the champions of both divisions.

"We didn't focus too much on winning but joined the league to get better competition and that goal was

achieved. We wrestled some great teams, like Fair Lawn twice (Blanchard's alma mater) and Cedar Grove. Both teams really pushed us to improve. It was great to see the progress of our wrestlers."

In addition, the program kept a team in the Suburban league. This group wrestled 9 dual meets and owned a record of 6 and 3. This league provided younger wrestlers with an outlet and an experience that was on their level.

"We are proud of both teams and our younger novice wrestlers. We were even able to run a new program (the brainchild of Coach Mike Siljanoski) called Little Raiders. This program was tailored towards 5 and 6 year olds to get them interested in the sport. It was fantastic."

The Nutley Junior Raiders are far from satisfied, but Blanchard has seen the progress he had planned for 10 years ago. The program has reached the summit and now the critical goal will be staying there. With a summer clinic planned (on the week of July 10th) that features wrestler Sammy Sasso of Ohio State, Coach Reece Humphrey of Princeton and the NJRTC, and Scott Goodale, Head Coach of Rutgers University, it is clear that Nutley cares about wrestling. The support of Mauro Tucci and Frank DeMaio has been vital. The many volunteer coaches are also integral to the success of the program.

"Next season since my son will be in 8th grade, I will be changing my role in our program and giving others a chance to lead. I will still be involved, but growth and progress demand change. It's the only constant in life and in sports." ■

While it is true that people with fair skin are at a higher risk, skin cancer can affect anyone, regardless of their skin color or ethnicity. People with darker skin tones may be less likely to develop skin cancer, but they are still at risk, and if they do develop it, it is often more aggressive and difficult to treat. Therefore, it is essential that everyone protects their skin from the sun and gets regular skin cancer screenings.
- SKIN CANCER CAN OCCUR ON ANY PART OF THE BODY Skin cancer can occur on any part of the body, not just the areas that are exposed to the sun. It can develop in areas such as the scalp, under the nails, or on the soles of the feet. Regularly check your entire body for any unusual moles or spots and get skin cancer screenings.
- EARLY DETECTION IS KEY The earlier skin cancer is detected, the easier it is to treat and the greater the chances of a full recovery. Dermatologists recommend performing regular self-examinations of your skin and getting a professional skin cancer screening at least once a year. If you notice any changes in your skin, such as new moles, growths, or changes in the color or shape of existing moles, see a dermatologist as soon as possible.
- SUN PROTECTION IS CRUCIAL Exposure to the sun's harmful ultraviolet (UV) rays is the leading cause of skin cancer but protecting your skin from the sun reduces your risk. Wear protective clothing, such as hats and long-sleeved



shirts, and use a broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher. It is also important to avoid tanning beds as they emit UV radiation that can cause skin damage and increase your risk of developing skin cancer.

■ SKIN CANCER IS TREATABLE The good news is that skin cancer is highly treatable, especially when caught early. There are several treatment options available including surgery, radiation therapy, and chemotherapy. Your dermatologist will recommend the best treatment option based on the type and stage of skin cancer you have.

Skin cancer is a serious and potentially life-threatening disease, but it is also highly preventable and treatable. Protect your skin from the sun, perform regular self-examinations, and get a professional skin cancer screening at least once a year. ■


