While Amanda and Justin are looking to make new memories here, they share a past that feels like a fairytale happily-ever-after.

"We met through mutual friends when we were 16," Amanda said. "Although we knew each other, we didn't reconnect until 2007 when we were 19 and in college. I was a sophomore at William Paterson University and Justin was a junior at Penn State University."

"We had a long-distance relationship for two years until I graduated in 2009," Justin said.

While their college degrees directed their choice of careers,


Reservation and Ramapo Mountain State Forest."

A Celebration of Its Citizens

"The Nutley Public Library takes immense pride in hosting the remarkable individuals who have been nominated for the Nutley Hall of Fame. We welcome these exceptional candidates and look forward to celebrating their achievements and contributions." –Michelle Salimbene Albert, Director of the Nutley Public Library

utley has always taken pride in its citizens and on November 19, from 2-5pm at the Nutley Public Library, eight people will be inducted into the prestigious Hall of Fame.

This honor will be bestowed on

those individuals who have achieved outstanding accomplishments beyond the boundaries of Nutley. Recognizing them also brings additional pride to the entire community.

The Hall of Fame began with an idea.

In 2001, Carmen Orechio wanted to spotlight Nutley residents who had outstanding accomplishments.

In 2002, Pat Ritacco, as chairman, established a formal committee to initiate action and set the ground rules of the Hall of Fame. The criteria they adopted are still in force today. All inductees must have been born in Nutley, graduated from Nutley High School, or lived in Nutley for at least 10 years. Their achievements need to have been made at the state, national, or international level, regardless of their field of endeavor.

The two-tiered system ensures the integrity of the induction process. The administrative committee determines that the eligibility requirements have been met and then a panel of judges reviews the merits of the nominees and determines if they are worthy of induction. The judges are Chair Joe Cervasio, Dr. John Dinan, Dr. Eileen Poliani, Dolores Capalbo, Fred Scalera, Marie Solimo, and John Simko.

Pat Ritacco emphasized the basis for choosing inductees with a focus on the significant changes they brought about. "If they had never lived, things would have been different."

The original members of the committee who joined Ritacco were Sandra (Sam) Carella, Mike Geltrude, Tony Iannarone, Frank Lemma, Phil White, Sarah Lester, and JoAnn Tropiano, former library director. They have since been joined by Phyllis Coldebella and Christina Osieja.

This is the township's 20th year of inducting outstanding Nutley citizens into this impressive group.

"The Nutley Hall of Fame is a true representation of the best of Nutley," Sam Carella said. "The individuals who are

chosen demonstrate to our residents, and most importantly, to the youth in Nutley, that anything is possible with hard work and commitment. After every induction ceremony, we are all in awe of the accomplishments of our esteemed inductees. We are so proud to say they are from our town." ■

GERI V. BERGEN (1930-2018): Raised in Nutley and 1948 Nutley High School (NHS) graduate, she was a forester and conservationist who turned her love of the outdoors into a groundbreaking career in forestry, a lifelong commitment to conservation, and a successful leadership role in natural resource management. She is known as a "Woman of Many Firsts," most notably being the first woman in the U.S. Forest Service to serve as Forest Supervisor.

• WILLIAM (BILL) CALLANAN JR. Raised in Nutley, a 1959 NHS graduate, and renowned jazz organist and recording artist, he toured worldwide as the pianist for Joey Dee and the Starliters before moving to Las Vegas to perform and conduct in orchestras for famous headliners. Bill later founded a jazz quartet of Las Vegas all-stars called the B3 Conspiracy where he played organ as a soloist and toured worldwide.

RON CORIO Raised in Nutley, a 1979 NHS graduate, and innovator and influencer in the global renewable energy sector, he is founder and Chief Innovation Officer at Array Technologies which pioneered solar tracking technology in 1989. His vision for renewable energy has led

EATON STONE (1818-1903): Retired in Nutley in 1867 where he remained for 27 years and nicknamed "The Wizard Horseman," he began as a plate spinner, a tumbler, and a horse groomer before he became an international star, one of the leading riders in the country, and the first circus rider to do a backward somersault on a speeding barebacked horse.

DAVID VERDI Raised in Nutley and 1974 NHS graduate, he is an award-winning media professional with a career spanning over three decades at NBC News. As the Senior Vice President of Worldwide News Gathering at NBC News, he exemplifies a deep commitment to journalistic excellence and holds the reins of NBC's news gathering operation on a global scale. Throughout his career Verdi has won three Emmy Awards, two Edward R. Murrow Awards, and a Peabody Award.

■ MICHAEL VOLPE Raised in Nutley and a 2005 NHS graduate, he is a music producer known professionally as beat-maker "Clams Casino." He has garnered attention from distinguished hip-hop artists for his original productions and new sounds and is one of hip-hop's most in demand rhythm designers and producers. ■

NUTLEY WRESTLING CLINIC Elite Moments

lite. It means a select group that is superior in terms of ability or qualities to the rest of a group or society. Elite people are leaders in their field of work and often inspire others to reach their fullest potential.

Nutley Junior Wrestling and the Nutley High School wrestling program share a vision to return Nutley to elite status. That became their mission over 5 years ago. The summer wrestling clinic is a means to that goal.



The Nutley Raiders Wrestling Clinic started in 2017. The premise: summer wrestlers make winter champions. It has also been a useful way to attract new wrestlers to the program. Additionally, it has become a great opportunity for Nutley to share its space with other local area wrestlers.

This year, Coach Michael Blanchard put together an allstar lineup that included some of the NCAA and world-level elite. In attendance this year were Coach Reece "Highlight" Humphrey of the NJRTC and Princeton University, wrestlers and NCAA All- Americans Sammy Sasso and Jesse Mendez of Ohio State University, Coach Joe Galante of The College of New Jersey, and Coach Scott Goodale of Rutgers University with wrestler Dylan Shawver. Gene Zanetti from Wrestling Mindset spoke to parents as well.

"All of these coaches and wrestlers brought their best to us, and we had over 85 wrestlers, 15 of whom were young women, who represent a growing staple of the wrestling community," Blanchard said. "They all learned some highlevel techniques while having a lot of fun."

The first night was about listening in order to learn–a focal point of any good instruction. The second night focused on gratitude for being able to participate in wrestling. The third night was all about being humble–another important part of becoming elite. The final night was centered on the idea that learning how to be a top-level wrestler can be a lot of fun.

"This clinic was one of the best yet in terms of participation and clinicians," Blanchard said. "We are grateful to so many who support us from Commissioner Mauro Tucci, Superintendent Frank DeMaio, the Parks and Recreation Department, Mike DiPiano (head coach of the NHS), Chris Andres (our social media specialist), and our numerous volunteer coaches who help us pull it off. We managed to run a food drive that yielded eight bags of food for the Nutley

A Nutley WW2 Veteran Returns Home By Bill Chivil

n September 10, 1944, a Grumman Avenger took off from the USS Enterprise (CV-6). The TBM-1C torpedo bomber was participating in Operation Forager, a pre-invasion strike on the Japanese forces occupying the Palau Islands. It was piloted by Lieutenant Jay Ross Manown Jr. and crewed by Navy Aviation Radioman Wilbur Mitts and Navy Ordnanceman Anthony Di Patetta, a Nutley resident.

World War 2 was entering its final phase. General Patton's Third Army had brought the battle for Europe onto German soil, while in the Pacific theatre, General MacArthur and Admiral Nimitz were continuing their march toward the Japanese homeland.

Over 300,000 American military personnel had lost their lives since the United States entered the war in 1941. On this day in late 1944, three more names would be added to the list of casualties.

After taking off from the Enterprise, the TBM Avenger was hit by enemy anti-aircraft fire and, according to the Defense

Hometown Heroes

POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA), was last seen spinning violently before crashing into the water near Malakal Island. All three aboard were declared

killed in action (KIA) and each was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart.

Following the war, efforts were made to recover the remains of those who were lost in the battle areas and crash sites in Palau. However, investigators were unable to locate any evidence of the aircraft or its crew.

In 2001, Project Recover, a non-profit organization that locates, identifies, and repatriates the remains of U.S. service members missing in action, began another search for the lost TBM along with Ships of Exploration and Discovery Research, a DPAA partner organization. After multiple recovery operations over several years, excavations yielded

human remains and material evidence, which were sent to Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii for analysis.

In 2023, almost 79 years later, the remains of Anthony Di Petta and Walter Mitts were identified by scientists from DPAA and the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System using DNA analysis.

On July 11th, a mass was held for Di Petta at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Nutley. Following the service, the funeral procession visited Nutley's World War 2 monument where town dignitaries, residents, and members of the American Legion Post 105 Color Guard paid their respects. Also in attendance were Suzanne Nakamura, Di Petta's niece, and Val Thal-Slocum of Project Recovery; both of whom were part of the procession.

Per the U.S. Navy Personnel Command, Anthony Di Petta was born on June 3, 1920 in Colle d'Anchise, Italy. His family emigrated to Nutley where Di Petta attended Lincoln School and graduated from Nutley High School. He enlisted in the United States Navy on December 6, 1939.

As the Nutley Public Affairs Department so perfectly noted, the memorial offered the community an opportunity to reflect on our freedoms and liberties, and to welcome home a local hero.

Anthony Di Petta was buried in Wrightstown, New Jersey later that day with full military honors. His fellow crewmember, Walter Mitts, was buried in Seaside, California on September 11. ■


