It takes about six days to set up the sale; the sale runs for three days with the last day being 'Fill a Bag Day.' Dolores admits it is a lot of work, but the pleasure she

Ellie Slomkowski, Friends of the Nutley Library Treasurer stated: "Quite a few students shop our book sale and found our young adult books quite a deal. One young boy toting a backpack over his shoulder asked how much a SpongeBob 3-disc DVD set cost. I first asked if he was going to give those DVDs to a good home and he said yes; he loved SpongeBob. I quoted him a price of one dollar and his eyes popped open in disbelief. He couldn't have thanked me enough, and the smile on his face made my day as well as all the work that we put in to having the book sale worth the effort."

One woman came every day of the sale. She said, "Every time I come, I see books I want."

Someone else said, "I donated the books I have read so now these books I am buying will fit on my shelves."

A young mother bought a bag of books and said, *"I read to my daughter every night."* Her baby is six months old, but you can never start too young!

Jennifer Hart, pictured with her son, said, "We love the library and the library book sale. My son, who is soon to be five years old, picked out 25 books. We always donate books as well. He must give away some to get more."

All proceeds from the sale are used to support the Nutley Public Library's programs. The second part of the semi-annual book sale will be held from October 27-29. We hope to see you then! ■

not the ultimate goal," she said. "Playing a team sport is about making memories and friendships that will last a lifetime. It also teaches kids how to handle adversity, teamwork, and sportsmanship. That's what I want to emphasize."

Sarah's method of getting these messages across is done in a very powerful and positive way.

"Praise! Praise! Praise!" she said. "I definitely let the girls know when something needs to improve, but I always build them back up."

Coach Misner's winning attitude translated into a phenomenal year for the team, but the stats were only part of what will be remembered.

"This year we had a fantastic record, and we outscored our opponents 60-13," she said. "However, my best memory will be how our team responded to verbal taunting and harassment by opposing teams. They learned just as much about character and integrity as they did soccer. They rallied around their teammates and never once lost their composure."

Sarah has high praise for the entire team which gave her many memorable moments.

"This group of girls is such a pleasure to coach," she said. "They all work hard and do whatever is asked. Each player has a role, but they are always willing to step up and play wherever I ask - even goalie! One of my favorite things about them is that they are tough as nails - never afraid to play physical and never ask to come out. Most importantly, they are just great kids!"

Her goals for next year include some new team tactics. "We are moving to 9v9, so our field is going to be bigger," and reinforcing skills "we want to continue working on spacing and playing the ball to the feet, not just kicking down the field."

Sarah started coaching girls' soccer in 2012 for the team her older daughter was on and took those players from U8 to U15. She has been with this current team since 2019, sat out the canceled season in 2020 because of the pandemic restrictions, and was back to Nutley United in the fall of 2021.

Sarah Misner is looking forward to another great season and adding some new girls to the team.

While she can't predict what their stats will be next year, her winning strategy as a coach will still include generous amounts of praise and the emphasis on learning life skills. The game is important, but so is what the game gives back to the players.

That's why her goal for each year is "to have every player come out for the team again."

That's the best kind of victory for Coach Sarah Misner. ■

The Rotary Club of Nutley Celebrates 100 Years of Service

he Rotary Club of Nutley held their Installation Dinner on Wednesday, June 8th at Nanina's in Belleville. The Nutley club received their charter on Dec. 22, 1922, having been sponsored by the Belleville club. Currently, Nutley has 30 members plus

10 honorary members and is a very active club. Fellowship, community service, vocational service, and international relations are the club's objectives.

During the pandemic, the club continued to carry out service projects, assisted in all the causes that they did prior to March 2020, and greatly expanded their support of the Nutley Family Service Bureau Pantry.

Since 1958, the Nutley Rotary Club has held a reception each fall to welcome the new teachers to our school system, and

while it was moved outside with all the necessary pandemic protocols, the program did not miss a beat. Rotary started an interest-free college loan program in 1926 which evolved into a scholarship program in 1959. Currently, Nutley Rotary awards three four-year scholarships, a vocational grant, and

prizes for the juried art program at the high school each year.

The club also supports a camp for children with disabilities, Camp Merry Heart in Hackettstown, where members maintain a cabin by doing all the required repairs. Rotary sends a camper each year to the facility. In 1932, Rotarian Dick Kastner organized Nutley's first Easter egg hunt. The eggs were boiled in the vats at Hoffmann-LaRoche and, like today, they were hidden in Memorial Park. A partnership with the Franklin Theatre, then managed by Nutley Rotarian Jim Cherry, expanded the program until a 1941 hiatus. After WWII, Nutley Civic Celebrations coordinated the project, which is now run by the township.

Nutley Rotary's fundraisers include a car show and a raffle. This year's car show will be Sunday, September 18th. This past year, a Cornhole Tournament was held and the club is planning a family fun bicycle event in the fall.

In the past, Nutley Rotary donated the

Planning is underway for a donation to commemorate this 100-year milestone. Rotary also donated

What is your name, position, and responsibilities at the library? My name is Laura Pecoraro, and I am a Reference Librarian here at Nutley Public Library. I assist people with the computer and printer, I can search for items and request them if we don't have them, and I can help people download e-books, e-audiobooks, and

movies to their mobile devices with our free library services hoopla, Libby, and Kanopy.

When did you start working at the library and why? I began working at Nutley Public Library in May 2021. However,

I've worked in libraries for over a decade, beginning in 2004 when I was a student worker in Seton Hall University's Walsh Library and transitioning to public libraries after graduation.

What is your educational background? I graduated from Seton Hall University with a bachelor's in 2007 and a master's in 2008, both in English. I completed my master's in Library and Information Sciences at Rutgers University in 2015.

It was later determined that the victim intended to attempt suicide and the heroic actions of Officers Rogers and Bassani made this a truly lifesaving rescue. ■


